He is passionate about equipping families to be incubators of faith and spiritual transformation and he lives to help parents and children put their faith in action.

A domain is a field of service or function. It's where one's knowledge, skill, expertise, interest, and/or concern is exercised. It's a broad umbrella representing an area of God-given callings and vocations, where things are created, cared for, changed, accomplished or expressed. It's where we spend much of our time and energy, forty to sixty hours each week, stewarding what Jesus has given us to do.

Is this list the be-all and end-all list

of societal spheres? No, not at all. The list is not nearly as important as intentionally identifying various domains and making disciples within those domains who will bring Jesus' character and ways to bear in them.

- 1. Looking for Domain Champions who will create mixer events to connect with others within a domain to pray for that domain, make disciples who make disciples within that domain, and connect with other believers within that domain to serve our world through Him and point them to Christ.
- 2. Domain Teams Enabling men to connect and team with others who serve in the same domain of society for the purpose of impacting our city, nation and world via prayer, making disciples, and strategic initiatives.
